in the County and State aforesaid, on or about the 23RD day of NOVEMBER, 2014,

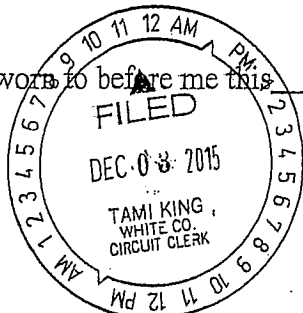

COMES NOW, **DETECTIVE TERRI LEE**, OF THE SEARCY POLICE DEPARTMENT AND AFTER BEING SWORN ON OATH STATES:

On November 23, 2014 at approximately 6:30 p.m., Searcy Police officers responded to 710 West Park Avenue in Searcy, regarding the report of a missing two-year old. Upon arrival, officers spoke to the child's father and the father's girlfriend, Lesley Marcotte. Marcotte stated she was in the bathtub with another child when Malik reportedly disappeared from the house. After an extensive search of the area failed to locate Malik, a criminal investigation was initiated.

During the course of the criminal investigation, numerous inconsistencies emerged regarding the initial report of Malik's disappearance. During several interviews with Marcotte, she continued to say she knew nothing about the disappearance of Malik except what she previously reported.

On November 23, 2015, Detective Terri Lee and Special Agent Charles B. Watkins (FBI) interviewed Marcotte in Springdale, Arkansas. Marcotte told us Malik's father beat Malik on Thursday, November 20, 2014 and Malik died shortly after. She said Malik's father kept his body hidden until early Sunday morning. Marcotte said Malik's father then took the body and disposed of it, but did not tell Marcotte where or how. Marcotte and Malik's father then staged the events on Sunday, November 23, 2014 to report that Malik was missing.

Between November 20, 2014 and November 23, 2014, Marcotte said she and Malik's father sat in the truck and came up with a plan. Marcotte said they tried to come up with a way to frame Malik's biological mother for taking Malik. Malik's father came up with the plan to tell police Malik walked out of the door. Malik's father said he would take Marcotte down with him if Marcotte told anyone what actually happened.

Marcotte said Malik's father took Malik's body and left 710 West Park at about 3:00 a.m., on Sunday morning, November 23, 2014. Marcotte said Malik's father came back about sunrise (approximately 6:30 a.m.). Marcotte said Malik's father was awake the whole weekend and told Marcotte what to do later that day in order to implement the prior plan to tell police Malik walked off. Malik's father told Marcotte to text him about Malik; to create the impression Malik was still alive that weekend.

I, therefore, request a warrant for Lesley Sue Marcotte, W/F, DOB 03/20/1988, SSN#
on one count of Hindering a Apprehension or Prosecution A.C.A 5-54-105, a class B Felony.


